"On December 12, 1936 the Sigma Alpha Sigma section of the Girls Club of Ball State Teachers College became the Alpha Sigma Alpha section. Hereafter they shall be called the Alpha Sigma Alpha sorority.

"In the fall of 1920 ten girls of Ball State Teachers College organized the Sigma Alpha Sigma section of the Girls Club. The first patroness of the section was Miss Bessie McVicker. In 1921 Mrs. M. C. Studebaker was elected as a patroness. In 1923 Miss McAvoy became a patroness to fill the vacancy made by Miss McVicker's departure. In 1925 Mrs. L. H. Whitcraft was elected to fill the vacancy made by Miss McAvoy. In the fall of 1928 Miss Exter Debra was elected a patroness.

"The section has always taken an active part in all college activities. Two rush parties are given at the beginning of each fall term; a luncheon is given on Home Coming for the alumnae, active members, and pledges.

"The section has been fortunate in its members. In 1926 Katherine Berlin was chosen as May Queen; in 1937 Mildred Little was elected as one of the most beautiful girls on the campus; and in 1923 Ruth Reifel was chosen as the most popular girl at the college. Ethel R. Harlan and Martha Garriott were elected charter members of Kappa Delta Pi.

"Miss Luella Davis became a patroness in the fall of 1930.

"The purpose and aim of the section is to instill the desire for high ideals and to inspire good will among its members.

"Fellowship and scholarship have been promoted to the fullest extent.
