Important Information

Students, please remember to file your FAFSA at FAFSA.gov. Many veterans are eligible for state sponsored grants and you will not receive these unless you file a FAFSA. Also, you will probably be eligible for low interest federal student loans which you many need in case of financial emergencies. It takes less than 30 minutes to fill out on average. You will need your social security number and your W2 form. If you haven't filed

your taxes you can estimate (This information was found at <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VRyXfUStHO0>). The FAFSA website also offers a help button online if you become confused. This must be done by March 10. Beck says please remember is your responsibility, not Financial Aid's or our office, to file your FAFSA by the deadline. To receive your money, you must file your FAFSA. If you are unsure how to file your

FAFSA, there are plenty of YouTube videos that will demonstrate how.

For National Guard Students: The number you usually call to confirm your enrollment in school is not working. Instead, call 888-442-4551 and follow the prompts. This will be the same as if you are calling the normal number.
